GAO also found that DOD has not minimized the amount of GFE it provides because: (1) applicable portions of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) and the DOD FAR Supplement are too broad; (2) contractors generally lack incentives to furnish their own equipment; and (3) DOD and the services have provided insufficient guidance to program managers and procurement officials on the appropriate uses of GFE. In addition, GAO found that: (1) a substantial portion of GFE is located at government-owned, contractor-operated (GOCO) plants which DOD and the services have not attempted to sell; (2) DOD has not sold some GFE because it is uncertain about its legal authority to sell excess equipment directly to contractors; (3) DOD does not adequately oversee contractors' acquisition, retention, and disposal of GFE; (4) some contractors ignore established controls over GFE, with DOD concurrence; (5) contractors frequently acquire GFE from commercial sources, without checking government inventories; (6) contractors frequently fail to dispose of excess equipment or properly document GFE transfers; and (7) DOD is developing a database for property managers to monitor GFE.
